Broadway House for Continuing Care Achieves Five-Star Quality Rating

Proadway House for Continuing Care has achieved a Five-Star Quality Rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), an agency operating under the Department of Health and Human Services.

CMS uses a Quality Rating System on a scale of 1 to 5 stars. Facilities with 5 stars are considered above average quality. The scores are based on the assessment of several critical areas including Overall Quality, Health Inspection, Quality Measures, Staffing and RN Staffing. According to CMS's web site, the purpose of the Five-Star Quality Rating System is to help consumers, their families, and caregivers compare nursing homes more easily and to help identify areas about which the public may want to ask questions.



"The Five-Star Rating achieved by the Broadway House for Continuing Care is confirmation of the organization's professional commitment to meeting Standards of Excellence in delivering quality care to each resident," said Broadway House President/CEO James Gonzalez. "In healthcare, quality is measured based on performance and the systematic and continuous process of quality improvement. The Broadway House workforce has displayed a strong level of commitment to excellence and will continue to assess and evaluate key quality measures to maintain the highest level of care and service for our residents."

New Look but the Same Important Mission: Continuing to Keep Seniors Safe and Secure

ith the start of a new year, the Senior Crimestoppers program logo has been updated with a new look, but the important mission remains the same: to help keep senior living communities safe and provide an enhanced quality of life.

Each year, all participating facilities in the Senior Crimestoppers program receive a confidential tracking graph charting the effect of overall incident reduction in their facility. This is benchmarked from historical past incidents as compared to currently reported incidents through calls to the tips line. These individual facility statistics are then compiled into a national profile showing the overall effect that the Senior Crimestoppers is having in all facilities that is serves.

The result of all of the program components working together is a 95% reduction of incidents of crime in Senior Crimestoppers facilities since the inception of the program. This cumulative effort provides safer, more secure and higher quality of life living environments for residents, staff members, family members and visitors.

Accordingly, Senior Crimestoppers awarded Broadway House a **2016 Facility Ribbon** signifying their participation in the accomplishment. The ribbon is displayed so all who live, work, and visit can see the positive effects achieved through adopting a zero tolerance-to-crime platform.

"Congratulations on being an integral part of keeping seniors safe, and thank you for your continued support of the Senior Crimestoppers program," wrote Judy Holcomb, VP, Assistant Program Director of Senior Crimestoppers, in a letter announcing the achievement.

St. James's staff of physicians, nurses, social workers and administrators will provide primary care, OBGYN, pediatrics and internal medicine. Broadway House will partner with St. James in every way possible to bring accessible, affordable care to the Ironbound community.






"This is a popular event on 2 levels" said Gloria Horton, Broadway House Director of Social Services. "It's timely and educational plus

In The News

Broadway House President/CEO James Gonzalez was featured extensively in <u>Provider</u> magazine's article entitled "Antibiotic Stewardship Takes a Village" that was published in the January 2017 issue.

<u>Provider</u> is a long-term and post-acute care monthly publication of the American Health Care Association and National Center for Assisted Living with a readership of over 52,000 professionals working in nursing facilities and assisted living communities nationally.

The article reviewed all the aspects of the federal government's aggressive agenda to combat antibiotic resistance. By November 28, 2017, skilled nursing centers must incorporate an antibiotic stewardship component in their Infection Control program. Mr. Gonzalez discussed Broadway House's history of antibiotic stewardship and its unique HIV-positive population and the program's successes and challenges. "The biggest challenge we face is with respect to stewardship is the interaction between HIV drugs and antibiotics," he says. "Physicians and advance practice nurses have to talk about these interactions and determine what's more important in terms of the patient's care. It's a 24-hour project in terms of monitoring care but it's a quality investment all nursing centers should make."
